





### Selective Glossary of Abrahamic Holy Days



Ramadan - The holiest month in Islam, observed by fasting from dawn to sunset, reflection, prayer, and increased devotion to Allah. Ramadan 2025 is expected to run from the

Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) - Commemorates the creation of the world.

Sukkot - Also called the "Feast of Tabernacles" and the "Feast of Booths." Commemorates the 40 years the Israelites spent in the desert after the Exodus.

Yom Kippur - The Day of Atonement, a solemn day of fasting, prayer, and repentance.
